as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature.

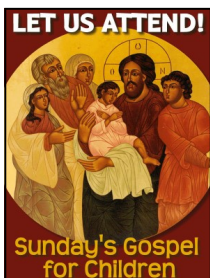

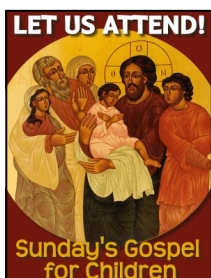
